eSmart Ambassador Initiative

Our 3 to 6 eSmart Ambassadors are very excited and proud of their recent initiative, Circle Time. Circle Time is a weekly classroom session around CybersSafety that is facilitated by each 3-6 classroom eSmart Ambassador.

'Facilitating Circle Time is a lot of fun. Students in the grade place any concerns about technology or cyber safety in the eSmart Circle Time box. Teachers look after the box and keep track of what is posted. Each week, I use Keynote on my iPad to present the Circle Time presentation. I mention the values of Circle Time which are Safety, Respect, Team Work, Empathy, Resilience, Understanding, Listening, Taking Turns, Your Opinions, Sharing Advice, Your Concerns and Your Privacy. After that, I show the grade a problem that someone has and we talk about how that person might be feeling and how we can solve the problem. We usually find that a lot of us have had the same problem. Kids have lots of ideas and they really want to help. I also show them some of the ages for Apps and let them guess what the age limit might be. Soon I will have a video to show them about how to stay safe online. Being an eSmart Ambassador is awesome!' Board games can play a crucial role in children's cognitive and social development as they improve logical thinking and reasoning skills, such as spatial reasoning. Board games are ideal for socialisation and developing communication skills as children also learn the importance of negotiation, fair play and the value of having rules. To see a child or team lose a game with a smile and immediately suggest, 'Let's have another game,' demonstrates resilience and a positive mindset. Or when the building blocks collapse, yet there is a determination to start all over again, is another example of how a child shows that they can persevere and bounce back from a situation of loss. Board games often generate much laughter. Laughing increases endorphins, the 'feel good' chemicals. Whether it be at home or school, board games are a great way to build many skills, relationships, happy memories and have a lot of FUN!

Collecting students early from school for an Appointment

Parents wishing to collect their child from school during school hours must receive approval via the office. Office staff will then call the classroom. Parent are required to **sign the student out before they leave**. Any person other than the parent wishing to collect a child during school hours must provide a written request from the parent. Students will not be released to anyone under the age of 18.

It is very difficult for students in the playground to hear announcements during recess and lunch times. It becomes very frustrating for parents when they come to collect their children during these times only to find they have to wait until after the break to be able to collect their child. To overcome this problem, parents wanting to collect students early will need to do so during class times:

9.00am to 11.05am 11.35am to 1.45pm 2.30pm to 3.30pm

Parents are still able to collect students early outside the above times, but we cannot guarantee the student will hear the announcement calling them to the office and, for safety reasons, we cannot allow parents into the school grounds to search for their children.

A non-refundable deposit of \$60 is payable by Friday 28th June to secure your child a place on the camp. A payment plan will commence there after so that the financial demands will not be too taxing for families.
