Goal Setting

Goal Setting is a fundamental part of learning that makes learning visible and relevant for students. Having clear learning goals helps students to understand their success criteria and provide the appropriate mix of success and challenge. Our students develop confidence in setting their own reading goals during teacher conferences. They are taught how to self-monitor their progress and provide evidence that they believe demonstrates the achievement of their goal.

Reading goals are set during reading conferences, which are scheduled between teachers and individual



students. The focus of the conference is based around a text independently selected by the student. Texts are sources from a range of 'just right' books which have been tailored to the interests and learning needs of each student.

Reading conferences usually follow independent reading and offer students the opportunity to:



- Share their thoughts about what they have read
- Receive feedback from the teacher, and
- Set goals for future reading.

The following students have proudly volunteered to proudly share their current reading goals and the strategies they will use to achieve the goals.



My reading goal is to find out the real mood and feelings within a text.

My strategies are looking at specific words, read a whole chapter to work out the inferred meaning, and explore the literal meaning and layers of meaning within text. 6A Michelle

My reading goal is to recognise how characters feel and change throughout a story.

My strategies are to stop reading and reflect after each chapter. I then reflect on what seems positive and negative. I will also write any feelings that have been expressed or inferred as evidence from the text. Calvin 6A



My reading goal is to use punctuation to help me to understand what I am reading.

My strategies are to slow down when reading and make sure that I stop at the full stops and pause at the commas. Marco 3I

My reading goal is to clarify unknown words.

My strategies are to use the clues from the sentence or paragraph (I may need to read the text again), illustrations or diagrams as clues to what the word means, record unknown words on sticky notes, search for the meaning in a class dictionary. Yen 3I

2019 Grades 3 & 4 Camp PGL Campaspe Downs Tuesday September 17 to Thursday 19, 2019

This year's camp will cost \$295 for the 3-day experience. The cost includes accommodation, activities, camp instructors and bus travel. As prices in petrol, food, wages, have risen, so have the cost of camps and buses.
