



#### **Prep Toy Expo**











#### **CSEF (Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund)**

If you are a holder of a GOVERNMENT CONCESSION CARD you may be eligible to receive CSEF (\$125.00 per child) to contribute towards the cost of Camps, Sports and Excursions. Application forms are available at the office.

#### IF YOU HAVE APPLIED FOR CSEF IN 2019 YOU DO NOT NEED TO RE-APPLY FOR 2020

#### Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.


